As a Boy Scout at 13 years of age I was awarded the "Pro Deo et Patria" (For God and Country) award. This is the most prestigious honor I have ever received. 
Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill then, our lives are defined less by what we have gotten, and more by what we give away.

Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserve because of sin. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death, and hell. We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, we have more because when we give we join in the bond of friend-ship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus we are reflecting the divine nature.
