Christmas 2020: But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart – St. Luke 2:19 I am going to suppose that most mothers following the birth of a child, whether it is the first or fifth, do not have a lot of time to ponder many things in their heart. There is just too much going on between visits by nurses and doctors, the adjusting to a different life style and schedule, and the planning for the homecoming. Yet, here in St. Luke, at the end of the familiar Christmas Gospel, we see that Mary treasured and pondered what was going on around her.

In the midst of giving birth in a stable, surrounded by animals and ragged shepherds, Mary takes it all in. She might see Joseph trying to convince the shepherds to come back later, only to let them in anyway at their insistence. She may see a lamb or ox nibbling at the straw that now serves as baby Jesus's crib. She hears thee accounts of angelic hosts proclaiming His birth. Imagine the stories she can tell her friends and family later on about that significant night. Certainly the sights, sounds, and odors were anything but normal.

What did it all mean? How much was happening because this was the Christ child, and how much was happening just due to the circumstances at the time?

We have so many family traditions surrounding the Christmas festival. Everything seems to go by in such a rush that the only memories we retain are those that are repeated year after year, without fail.

The national pandemic has changed everything in 2020. This year, if permitted, is the perfect time to take a moment to treasure what is going on around us and ponder it all in our hearts. Treasure the gathering of family, treasure a church service on Christmas Eve in person or by live streaming, treasure the singing of carols and the lighting of candles, treasure the story of the Christ child's birth, and treasure the Christian fellowship that we have together, even if it is only for a few minutes under stipulations and abnormal restrictions.

Ponder how Christ came and died for all. Ponder how Christ comes to each of us in His gifts of Word and sacrament when we come to church. Ponder how those carols and the hymns that we sing are confessions of the faith that the Holy Spirit has passed down from generation to generation. Treasure these things; ponder them in your heart. Rejoice in what Christ has done for you.

Christmas Eve Services: Due to restrictions for the COVID-19 virus, our seating is limited to allow for social distancing. To accommodate an anticipated larger attendance on December 24th, we plan to have two services that day. One will be at 3:00 PM and another at 5:30 PM. Both will be traditional candle lighting services with reduced liturgy. Families and friends will be asked to make reservations for their desired service time so that we can observe capacity guidelines with governmental restrictions in place. 



Christmas is coming. It is a joyous time of feasting. The Church feasts upon the Word of God in sermon, song, and sacrament.

We hear the proclamation of the message of the angels: "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:10-11). We mingle our voices with theirs as we sing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased" (Luke 2:14)! We receive the proclaimed Savior, Christ the Lord, not wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in manger but wrapped in bread and wine placed into our mouths for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. We feast in great joy indeed because of this great blessing from our Lord and God. God's people in ancient Israel also feasted with great joy. The Lord showered His abundant blessing on His peo-

ple. And He commanded them to feast upon it (Deuteronomy 16). The people were to go to the place appointed, where the Lord would make His name dwell, and give offerings, each man as he was able, according to the blessing of the Lord that He had given them (Deut. 16:10, 15, 17).

And there the Lord would bless them with joy as they feasted upon what the Lord had provided. They ate of the choice parts of their offerings. They enjoyed the company of all the people of God as they together heard His promises of blessing, sang of His bountiful goodness, and partook of what He gave.

We feast on the Word who became flesh to dwell among us, not just during Christmas but throughout all the year. We feast not just on the salvation He has wrought for us in His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, but we feast also on all the temporal blessings that God gives out of His fatherly divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in us. We enjoy the rich bounty that God provides, not only in Word and Sacrament, but also in house and home, property and income, family and friends.

Let us, like them, give generously of the first fruits of our income, which He gives, so that all may know and enjoy the salvation He gives and the joy we have in the Savior born in the city of David, who is Christ the Lord.
