Light of the World: *Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.” John 8:12*

If you take yourself back to Jesus’ day, light was the perfect illustration for Him to use because darkness was so prevalent. Today we have lights on nearly every street, houses have electricity with the flip of a switch, and we even have a pretty decent flashlight with the push of a button on our phones. None of that existed in Jesus’ day. When the sun went down, you lit a candle; otherwise you would sit in utter darkness.


Even from the beginning of God’s Creation, darkness described a world that was formless and void, empty before God’s powerful Word brought order and beauty to it. But when you look closely, darkness and light are used extensively in Scripture, almost always describing belief and unbelief.

Light and darkness are among the most prominent themes in John’s Gospel. The prophets of old foretold Jesus’ coming as light of the world. It was the Father’s will to send His beloved Son into a world cloaked in the darkness of sin and unbelief. As Mary brought forth her firstborn Son, the true light that was promised to come into the world dawned. A single, solitary child, born in the dark Judean countryside would bring life and immortality to light for all people.

Though we live in a time of illuminated screens and bright shining devices, ours is still a world that is cloaked in the darkness of sin and unbelief. Yet, as the Gospel is proclaimed in our congregations and announced in our homes, Jesus, the light of the world shines brightly for all. The Gospel is for all people because Jesus Christ came to be the light for all the world, for people from every nation. God’s grace is universal, for all who believe in Jesus.

Our prayer is that Jesus Christ, the light of the world, will continue to brightly shine as the Gospel is preached and taught in churches and schools and as it is shared by individual Christians in their varied vocations at work, home and play. Into the darkness, God shines the light of Christ as we are sent out to reflect His light and love. Thanks be to God that people from every tribe, nation, language and people may find hope in our Savior Jesus and the light of His love.

Almighty God, You brought life and immortality to light. May the Light of Your Christ shine brightly in the world so that many more may be brought to saving faith and life with Him and His saints for all eternity; for You live and reign with the Son and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Christmas poinsettias will once again be used to decorate our Sanctuary to enhance the beauty of God's house this Christmas. It is a wonderful opportunity to remember loved ones in memorial or tribute by dedicating one or more of these plants.

The price will be approximately \$10 each, and you may take them home following the December 28th worship service. Women of Faith: The ladies will hold their annual Christmas luncheon at noon on December 11th hosted by Carol Cook in the Church fellowship hall. Bring a dish to pass and a white elephant gift; a meat entrée will be provided along with Christmas games and fellowship. Let Mary or Carol know if you plan on attending.

In December your mites go for LWML Grant #5 which will allow Lutheran Braille Workers to produce and freely distribute approximately 10,000 additional volumes of Bibles and other Christian materials in braille or specialized large print to people who are blind or visually impaired and in need of knowing Jesus as their Savior. The funds will purchase specialized paper, cardstock, braille plates, and equipment, and help to meet training and shipping costs to support this endeavor. This project provides physical, mental, and spiritual benefits not only to the recipients of these materials, but also to all of the faithful, dedicated volunteers who produce and distribute God's Word to the visually impaired. Thank you for your mites and your prayers for this Mission Grant.

2025 Operation Thankful is a program sponsored by our Faith congregation this Advent season to assist the Kewanee Food Pantry. Members are encouraged to bring donations of non-perishable food items or dollars to worship services during this season. Soup and cereal is most needed at this time. This has been approved as a Thrivent Action project and \$250 has been received. This is a wonderful way for us to show our Christian love for the fellow citizens in our community. Items will be collected thru December.



Church Council Report: The treasurer's November report was distributed and Sue reported that the general fund has \$41,105.51 which includes the \$2893.41 proceeds from the Oktoberfest, the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$9,727.19 for a total of \$50,832.70. The church extension fund balance is \$98,057.44. The Glen Godke memorial monies totaled \$215.00. Repair cost for the elevator totaled \$26,953.23.



Christmas Eve service will begin at 5:30 PM. The death of Janet Estes was noted. A letter to our delinquent members was read with a minor addition. This letter will be sent in December to those on the published list for possible removal.

A solar night light was installed at the rear of the church where the electrical wiring had been broken. A contract was signed with Getz Fire Protection to do a required 5 year hydrostatic test on our fire suppression system for \$3500.

Church Christmas decorations will be put up on December 6th at 9:00 am. A 2026 budget and nomination of officers will be on the agenda for next month's meeting after the Advent service..

Q: Why is the color blue used for Advent season?

A: Blue is the more contemporary color increasingly used by many congregations in their observance of a new church year. Advent, a preparatory time of waiting and watching, communicates the message of hope. Blue, the color of the sky, helps convey that powerful message. Our Christian faith rests on the hope that Christ, who came in history assuming our flesh, will also return on the last day of time from that same blue sky he ascended long ago.
