Love on a Cross

The origin of the stylized heart \forall as a symbol of love may go back to the Greek culture of 8th century B.C.; long before the time of St. Valentine in the 3rd century A.D., who was martyred for his Christian faith.

However, Martin Luther made perhaps the most famous connection between the stylized heart and true love (the love of Christ expressed for us on the cross). Luther did this with his "Luther Rose" seal.

Luther designed this seal in cooperation with an ardent supporter of the Reformation, Lazarus Spengler. Spengler was the town clerk in Nüremberg, but also a gifted lay-theologian and hymn writer.

Luther explained the symbolism of the seal in the following words:

"The cross, black, is placed in a heart, which should be of its natural color (red), to put me in mind that faith in Christ crucified saved us. For if one believes from the heart, he will be justified ['For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved.' Rom. 10:10].

Even though it is a black cross, which mortifies and which also should hurt us, yet it leaves the heart in its natural color and does not ruin nature...that is, the cross does not kill, but keeps man alive. For the just shall live by faith, by faith in the Savior ['This Good News tells us how God makes us right in His sight. This is accomplished from start to finish by faith. As the Scriptures say, "For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, 'The righteous shall live by faith. "'Rom. 1:17].

Such a heart is to be in the midst of a white rose, to symbolize that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace.

In a word, it places the believer into a white joyful rose, for this faith does not give peace and joy as the world gives ["Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." John 14:27].

Therefore, the rose is to be white, not red, for white is the color of the spirits and of all angels ['An angel of the Lord came down from heaven and rolled aside the stone and sat on it. His face shone like lightening, and his clothing was as white as snow.' Matt. 28:2b-3 and 'She saw two white-robed angels sitting at the head and foot of the place where the body of Jesus had been lying.' John 20:12].



This rose, moreover, is fixed in a skyblue field, symbolizing that such joy in the Spirit and in faith is a beginning of the future heavenly joy. It is already a part of faith, and is grasped through hope, even though not yet manifest.

And around this field is a golden ring, to signify that such bliss in heaven is

endless, and more precious than all joys and goods, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal.

May Christ, our dear Lord, be with your spirit until the life to come. Amen."*

As you celebrate the beautiful, but imperfect, love between man and woman this Valentine's Day; remember the source of true, perfect, and *eternal* love, Jesus Christ; who showed the *heart* of His love on a cross.

Planet Zoom is a zip, zap, zoomin' good time for kids of all ages. There's a whole new world Planet Zoom where **little is BIG**.



<u>February 17 (Ash Wednesday):</u> "Life's Better in *My* Hands" (1 Peter 2:20-25) Jesus said, "Father, into *Your* hands I commit My spirit." *We* tend to think, "Hand over my life to *someone else*? No way!"

<u>February 24:</u> "I'm Being True to Myself!" (1 Peter 1:22-25) Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they

<u>March 3:</u> "This Is It???" (1 Peter 1:3-5)




"Pay Off Mortgage" (P.O.M) Report
