Free but United: This month we, with many other Americans, will again celebrate Independence Day on July Fourth. The American dream of independence is strong in our culture, and strong in our flesh, but it is not a part of our Christian faith. True Christians are free thinking individuals, but in faith they are united as we at Faith boldly confess each Sunday our belief, in "one Holy Christian church." (*Apostles Creed, Article III and Nicene Creed*)

What is this church? It is all people who the Holy Spirit has gathered to Christ in faith throughout the world. The holy church exists wherever sinners gather at the font and are sealed with God's name in Holy Baptism, wherever a called servant of Christ announces the grace of God to sinners in Christ's stead, and wherever sinners gather in repentant joy at the altar of Christ to receive His body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. (Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation)

The unity of the Church has been established by God. That's why St. Paul urges us to "maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." We don't create the unity. We are called to maintain it. God has established the unity of the church, as St. Paul says: "There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." (*Ephesians 4:1-6*) Yes, the one true triune God establishes the one true church. From the unity of God comes the unity of the church. There is one body—one holy Christian and apostolic church. There is one hope—one heaven. There is one faith—one pure, biblical gospel. There is one baptism as we confess in the Nicene Creed, "I acknowledge one baptism, for the remission of sins."

The fact that the church is God's building project makes a big difference. It is a divine institution, founded by Christ himself and central to God's plan for the ages. God will not abandon His church. He will not abandon us. God has in all times and places gathered His church by the voice of Christ through the voice of His preachers, from Adam to Christ and His apostles, and to those whom He still sends today.

Because we believe does not mean we can see or fully experience the one, holy Christian church. From an earthly perspective there does not appear to be much in which to believe. Divisions crept into the church during the days of the apostles, and they still do today. Currently, some Christians may believe that no one possesses a true and pure confession of God's Word. Yet, the church is still here. Even now, before the final day, the church is known on earth in worship, where God gives, and His saints receive, the forgiveness offered in Jesus' name, and we give Him joyful thanks. (1)

The world, our society and culture, and our government are rapidly becoming more hostile to God's word and to His church. First Amendment religious freedoms and rights are today being challenged in our courts. Abortion and LGBTQ rights have been given status and funding above the unalienable rights of humans, decreed by God as written in the Constitution, preventing objections on religious grounds. (1)

Even though we walk through this dark valley, we have God's promise that He is in control, and will guide us to greener pastures, and we shall one day dwell in the house of the Lord forever. No persecution can stop His church or put it out of business. Christ is building His church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. In His church we have His peace and promises.

Council Action: Sue reported the General fund has \$44,523.46 and the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$17,069.26 for a grand total of \$61,582.72. Sue reported a member has given \$600 directed to the mortgage balance, and these additional monies were sent along with the June payment to CID-CEF.



The Elders suggested that the church resume Communion at the rail and the use of the Chalice be renewed. It was also recommended the ribbons be removed and open seating resumed. Sunday Bible Classes will resume this fall. Organist Cheryl is recovering from her hip surgery, and would like to play again on June 27th. Phyllis Weidle was thanked for her service during Cheryl's absence.

Work on the entrance landscaping project was completed with three new plantings added. The drive and parking lot have been sprayed for grass and weeds using the church's equipment. Large cracks have opened up again in the asphalt parking area. Ted will get estimates to commercially fill these before winter. Ted requested a load of black dirt be obtained to fill voids on both north and south sides of the building. Council agreed that these actions should be taken.

A fund-raising Oktoberfest dinner was discussed and it was decided to prepare for one again this fall. Suggestions for use of the funds are requested. July 11 was selected for the Voter's Assembly Meeting after the worship service.
