## The Strength of the Son

I keep hearing from people that this Springtime is one of the most anticipated in recent memory. This winter's especially harsh combination of dreary darkness, bitter cold, ice, snow, and slush, has made many especially yearn for the warmth and brightness of Springtime.

This year, the first official day of Spring is Saturday, March 20<sup>th</sup>. (If you're *really* anxious for that official start of Spring, look for it at 12:32 pm on the 20<sup>th</sup>). But, good news is that the sunlight will have been increasing in strength for weeks *before* March 20<sup>th</sup>,

bringing warmth, light, and hope to the cold upper Midwest of this country.

The Lenten season in which we're in is a reminder of hope also—a sure and certain hope. The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word "lencten," which referred to "spring"—the lengthening of the days, and the strengthening of the sunlight after winter is over.

In the Church Year, Lent is that time when we especially focus on the gift of eternal life earned for us by Jesus' suffering and death—His carrying the complete, dismal burden of our sins upon the cross; and paying for it completely.

Thus, we know with certainty that we will have "eternal Spring" in heaven. We don't look to ourselves for light and hope and life, but we look to the Son—the Son of God—and His cross for that assurance.

The prophet Malachi reminds us, "For behold, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble. The day that is coming shall set them ablaze, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor

branch. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall" (Malachi 4:1-2).

Few of us will be able to go "leaping like calves" into the springtime warmth of this earth—hobbling like aged Herfords might be more like it. However, all those who look to the strength of the Son of God for the assurance of their eternal life will "leap like calves" in the blessed eternity of heaven; where, "The sun shall be no more your light by day, nor for brightness shall the moon give you light; but the LORD will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory" (Isaiah 60:19).

In the meantime, where do we find true light, warmth, and hope? No, not in Florida or Arizona. We find it right here in Kewanee, at 620 Hepner Drive, even on cloudly Sunday mornings and dark Wednesday evenings.

The psalmist reminds us of the warmth and light which are found only in the House of God, "For a day in your courts is better than a

thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of wickedness. For the LORD God is a sun and shield; the LORD bestows favor and honor. No good thing does he withhold from those who walk uprightly. O LORD of hosts, blessed is the one who trusts in you!" (Psalm 84:10-12)

There's no place on this earth where the strength of the Son is stronger than in His House, around His Word and Sacraments. Come in, and let Him be your "sun and shield, bestowing you favor and honor"

March 17: "How Can I Believe in a God Who Would..." (1 Peter 4:12-25)


Jesus cried, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me" Is there vindication for believing in God even in the toughest times in life?

## They Had a Pet Turtle


That's all I can remember about my neighbors. What they did, where they were from, even their names have vanished from my memory.

#### **Earthquakes**

Late-breaking news as this newsletter is being completed is that a massive earthquake has occurred in

Chili. With the recent massive earthquakes in Haiti and Chili, and the many more smaller earthquakes happening throughout the world, we're reminded of the words of Jesus regarding the End Times, "For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. These are but the beginning of the birth pains" (Mark 13:8).

Earthquakes, and other natural disasters, are reminders to us that this earth isn't our permanent home. Since the Fall into Sin, this world has been corrupted by sin, the devil, and our own sinful nature. Jesus Christ will be coming in glory soon (perhaps very soon) to take us from this temporary, sin-corrupted, earth; to our permanent, trouble-free, heavenly home. We should certainly be prepared to meet Jesus in faith at *any* time; be it at the time of our death, or at the time of His Second Coming.

Throughout history, God has used earthquakes as "wake-up calls" to His complacent people. Yet, the "Reformation Psalm", Psalm 46, reminds believers, "We will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling" (Psalm 46:2-3).

We also appreciate the words of warning and comfort which Martin Luther wrote concerning this Psalm, and all the earthly troubles which afflict us:

- 1. A mighty Fortress is our God,
  A trusty Shield and Weapon;
  He helps us free from every need
  That hath us now o'ertaken.
  The old evil Foe
  Now means deadly woe;
  Deep guile and great might
  Are his dread arms in fight;
  On Earth is not his equal.
- With might of ours can naught be done, Soon were our loss effected; But for us fights the Valiant One, Whom God Himself elected. Ask ye, Who is this? Jesus Christ it is. Of Sabaoth Lord, And there's none other God; He holds the field forever.



# LCMS Continues Outreach to Haiti Quake Survivors

As the death toll in Haiti climbs toward 300,000 and with an estimated 1.2 million Haitians living on the streets, the Synod continues its efforts to reach out in mercy to its partner church,

the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti (ELCH). As of Feb. 24, LCMS members, churches, and schools from across the nation raised almost \$4 million and donated semi-truckloads of material donations for the LCMS response in Haiti. Thrivent Financial for Lutherans matched gifts to LCMS World Relief and Human Care, raising \$215,000.

LCMS WR-HC will continue to focus on providing temporary shelter to homeless Haitians, improving water and sanitation in places where the homeless are gathering, and continuing to supply food and hygiene items. Already, four Mercy Medical Teams (MMTs) have seen hundreds of critically ill patients in Jimani, and 1,200 more patients at clinics in Jacmel and Port-au-Prince.

Rev. Matthew Harrison said, "Those of us who have been on the ground in Haiti have been deeply traumatized. Yet we have suffered but the tiniest particle of what Haitians are suffering. I bury my thoughts in Christ's cross, the place I see the purpose of suffering most clearly. Haiti will remain Haiti. But I want the people of the Missouri Synod to know two things: 1. We have wonderful and capable Haitian Lutheran brothers and sisters serving others mightily with our help; and 2. Through specific strategic choices (in large measure by LCMS World Relief and Human Care), the LCMS today has tremendous capacity to reach out in love in time of disaster. Amid all the weakness and suffering, this is a great moment for the church. I'm proud of the LCMS."
