We know two things: (1) The United States of America has become one of the greatest mission fields in the world as the statistic for the "unchurched" grows at a staggering rate. (2) Jesus commanded His disciples to proclaim a message of repentance and forgiveness of sins to the ends of the earth, starting from the heart of the local city. But what about little old me in my daily life? Does the thought of "being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you" send chills down your spine? Take heart. You have been equipped to tell others the Good News of Jesus Christ, who is the reason for your hope. You know how to confess your faith, and you practice it every week. On a regular basis, the whole Christian Church on earth confesses the ancient creeds that have been handed down to us. Letter Carriers and Food Pantry Food Drive: Kewanee Letter Carriers and the Kewanee Food Pantry are holding a community food drive to be held on Saturday, May 13th. The Kewanee Food Pantry continues the mission of providing food to individuals and families. Many are unable to provide for basic food requirements because of lack of employment or income, inability to secure enough assistance from other agencies, or because of emergency situations.

Rebuilding Together Henry County is an organization in Henry County that helps lower income people with health and safety related home repairs and upgrades. A local Kewanee group has been organized to review and approve projects for rehabilitation in Kewanee. Funds for materials and volunteer manpower are needed to help complete these projects. All Kewanee congregations have been asked to contribute to their effort. The Church Council has approved the collection of a door offering to be held after the first two Sunday services in May for this purpose for anyone wanting to assist RTHC. 2017 is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation and Martin Luther's posting of the 95 theses on the door of the Wittenberg's Castle Church. In the recent past, members of the CID-LCMS have been instrumental in rebuilding Wittenberg's Old Latin School and repurposing it into the International Lutheran Center. Additional support is needed for special 500th Anniversary programming at the Center. Tours, lectures, concerts, and socials will draw people from outside the Church to learn about Jesus, and salvation by grace, through faith in Him.

God has given mothers a high calling in this world to participate in giving life, and to nurture and raise their children in the ways and love

of the Lord. Nothing is more important in the world than that responsibility, and so it is good for us to give thanks and honor to our mothers.

"It is more blessed to give than to receive," said St. Paul, quoting our Lord (Acts 20:35). How can this be? Jesus and His disciples withdrew to a mountain by the shore of the Sea of Galilee. The crowds followed them, for the Lord had just showered upon them the gift of His teaching, the gift of His Word. But the day was waning; the sun was setting, and it was getting late. Looking upon the crowds, Jesus had compassion on them and asked, "Where are we to buy bread, so that these people may eat" (John 6:5)? Philip said that two hundred denarii (a day's wages for two hundred men) could not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little.

But Andrew, Peter's brother, brought a young boy forward, who had five barley loaves and two small fish. "But," Andrew asked, "what are they for so many" (John 6:9). Jesus replied, "Have the people sit down" (John 6:10).

Then Jesus, the Son of God, gave them a second gift, a gift only He could give—a gift from above. He took the bread and the fish, gave thanks, blessed them, and distributed them to the crowd. Then came the miracle. As these five loaves and two fish were given out, they multiplied. He fed the hungry crowd until they were all full. And twelve baskets full were left over.

But Jesus was not the only one who gave that day. There is one person who also gave from what he had. It was the boy with the five loaves and the two fish. All the others, including the boy, received the gift of a miraculous feast. And they would look back on it with wonder. But the boy, when he would look back on it, would look back and remember not just what he received. He would look back with wonder and delight when the Son of God made his gift into something miraculous. For it is more blessed to give than to receive.
