Oh Give thanks: Especially at this time of year we receive a lot of mail appeals from various charity organizations requesting a donation. Many of them include some token gift, i.e. a coin, note pad, or address stickers, to urge the recipient to follow through with monetary support in return. This plays on the human nature to give when you receive. When given a gift whether nominal in value or expensive, some type of gratitude is expected in return. What does God expect in return for His blessings which He bestows on us? Nothing, for it is impossible to give God anything.

Why do we thank God for all his benefits? Thanksgiving, a national holiday is approaching and throughout our country peoples' attention will turn to travel, family and turkey dinners, football games, and holiday sales. Some may give a passing thought to the rich blessings such as freedom, family, home, and health, which God has given to them. Thankful hearts should always come together in worship and prayer, praising Him from whom all blessings flow. Scripture provides us with the proper motivation for giving thanks. God provides us with a multitude of blessings, things we associate with the First Article of the Creed (all creation and all our necessities) or the fourth petition of the Lord's Prayer (our daily bread). We have not only those things, but also the greatest gift, salvation by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, that which we confess in the Second Article of the Creed. John reminds us in his first epistle, "We love because He first loved us." There is the proper motivation for giving thanks to God. "Oh give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; for His steadfast loves endures forever." Psalm 118:1

Martin Luther indicates in his explanation of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed, our duty is to offer up thanksgiving, praise, service and obedience. "For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him." These things are an expression of thanks for the benefits the Lord gives to us by sacrificing His Son. It is by God's mercy and love that we are redeemed and made new again in Christ.

We see how true thanksgiving begins, with the receiving of the gracious gifts of our God. Unlike the nine lepers who failed to acknowledge Jesus' pure loving act {Luke 17}, we should not neglect to express our gratitude to God as we get wrapped up in our family, the turkey with trimmings, parades and football all day, and door busting sales. We easily can be clouded by material possessions and the good life that we have. In the midst of those things, it is hard to remember where the blessings come from. More importantly, we forget that man does not live on bread alone, but on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

What matters is not just our daily bread, but the crucial bread, the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ. God gave His only begotten Son, to be born of a Virgin, to be born under the Law to redeem us who are under the Law. The Sacrament of the Altar is the only Thanksgiving meal in town you'll feel better after eating and drinking; there's always room for more Jesus. It is a gift from God with no strings attached. The more we thank God the Father through Jesus Christ His dear Son, the more we recognize how generously and bountifully He deals with us. Thanksgiving begins by receiving our Lord and the fruits of His death and Resurrection, Holy Baptism, Holy Absolution, Holy Communion. Rejoice in our God given faith that has healed and saved us.


We had lots of wonderful and tasty donated desserts to compliment the supper. Thank to all those members for these.

Church Council Action: At the October meeting the treasurer's report indicated the general fund balance was \$22,206 and the designated fund balance was \$21,333. No bills for repairing the elevator have been received.

Trustee reported that a roof vent has collapsed and some shingles have blown off. Cost to replace these items is estimated to be \$300. A sink hole on the south lawn has opened up most probably from a broken runoff tile. It will be repaired as weather and time allow. The elevator inspection is scheduled for October 22. Our building insurance policy is being rewritten by Rockford Mutual, and more information will be forthcoming.

Advent worship services will be scheduled in December on Thursday evenings beginning at 6:30 PM. The next Voters' Assemble is scheduled for January 5th, 2020 to elect new officers and approve a congregational budget. In new business it the locking of the front doors during services and meetings was discussed and was decided to instruct the ushers to do so for security reasons

Veterans' Day 2019 is a federal holiday (previously known as Armistice Day) observed annually on November 11, not only in the United States but in many other countries throughout the world.
