What is truth?

"Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them." Eph. 5:11

What deceptive and divisive days we are encountering! It is all so disheartening and fruitless. Heated arguments develop over the "right" way to handle the pandemic, the benefits or even personal virtue of wearing masks or not, and the "true" science behind it all. At the same time accusations fly regarding who is "responsible" for the hundreds of thousands of deaths or the struggling economy.

The nation is divided on whether systemic racism and social injustice is rampant or if there may be other factors contributing to socioeconomic inequities and experiential disparities. People take strong positions on whether they believe we as a nation are as deeply racist as in the 60s or if the majority of people actually do judge people "not by the color of their skin but by the content of their character."

Hostilities arise when lines are drawn between those who believe that rioting and looting, attacking and killing police officers, and taking over municipalities to disallow law enforcement are a natural, necessary response to wide-spread injustice or if these represent an unjustified and irrational overreaction to the horrific acts of isolated individuals.

When one sees the posts on Facebook and continues to read the sometimes mean-spirited comments which attack the character or motives of others, it is disturbing. When one watches the clearly biased news from the left and the right picking and choosing what they will report and how, or sees how they often report things out of context and with the support of half-truths, it is clear that we are being deceived. And you know who is behind it right? No it is not TRUMP or BIDEN. It is not PELOSI or MCCONNELL. It is not even CNN or FOX. It is SATAN. And he is reveling in all of the division, self-righteous accusations, hatred and violence that is taking hold of us.

To be honest, with so many things going on and the opposing views which are presented as fact, I am sometimes left asking with Pilate: "What is truth?"

I encourage all of you, as God's redeemed people to take off your blinders and try to put aside whatever political or ideological filters you have been wearing. Do not allow yourself to embrace the open defamation of others or to assume the worst when it comes to people's motives. Do not simply go along with a story or a post because it agrees with your agenda without considering if it is fair, legitimate and truthfully supported. Listen to one another without judgment or accusation and have civil conversations that are intended to heal, establish unity in Christ, and help your neighbor.

Consider these words from Ephesians 5: "Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. Therefore do not become partners with them; for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true, and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them."

I exhort you in Christ, to give attention to these words and to apply them to your continued consumption of information and to your discourse regarding what is going on in this fallen world. Do not let the deceiver get his hooks in you, but always seek what is good, right, true and pleasing to the Lord. In all things remember to speak the TRUTH in LOVE.



Right: WOF collecting disposable diapers for Henry/Stark Counties Health Dept.






Turn those clocks back one hour on Saturday night, October 31 before going to bed as DST ends 11/01.


Council News: On October 20th the Church council met. The Treasurer reported the General Fund balance was \$38,246.91 and the Designated Fund balance was \$17,255.07. Trustee reports the elevator has begun making noises when lifting, requiring another call for maintenance repair. Women of Faith was thanked for cleaning the kitchen and fellowship hall. Approved was a food collection for Kewanee food pantry during the upcoming Advent season.

Next month the council will begin work on next years' budget and officer nominations. Anyone willing to serve as Treasurer, Vice Chairman, or Elder is asked to inform any council member or Pastor.
