**What is marriage?** Mark 10:6 –8 "But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh."

In recent years, our country – along with most all the (formerly) Christian nations of Europe – has lost its way when it comes to marriage. Check out the media. Surf the web. Gay marriage is the hot topic of our rapidly-changing culture. Many young people view marriage equality as the civil rights issue of our time. Others think it's all about love. And truth be told, many Christians feel embarrassed. Almost all of us have friends and relatives who struggle with homosexuality, and we love them dearly. Living together is common among us, and even Christian divorce rates are high. Who are we to talk? And who wants to be labeled a hater or called a big-ot?

We have ignored the fact that it is God who created us. We always go off the tracks when we forget that He made us and that everything good in this world comes from His hand. In big things and in small things, in the life of a nation or the life of an individual, things go dreadfully wrong when we ignore the Creator's instructions for life. Marriage binds a man to his wife and binds parents to their children. By our selfishness, we have often made a mess of things, but God's design is still good.

More than a mere moral issue, marriage gets to the heart of our faith. St. Paul compares it to Christ's sacrificial love for His bride, the Church (Eph. 5:25–26). When we confess marriage, we confess the Lord who created us male and female. When we confess marriage, we proclaim our heavenly hope, looking forward to the day when the Church, "prepared as a bride adorned for her husband," meets our Lord face-to-face (Rev. 21:1–2).

The religious freedom, guaranteed in our nation's Constitution, today is eroding amid continuous assaults. Redefining marriage, as the Supreme court has done, is a direct and demonstrated threat to religious freedom that marginalizes those who affirm marriage as the union of a man and a woman. Where the government, the culture and faith conflict, all Christians can and must speak up and out in support of religious liberty. The Supreme Court, like any human institution, is prone to errors. As Christians, we recognize that there is a higher heavenly court and that God's Word does not change. We also recognize that unjust decisions must be challenged for the good of our citizens.

When we stand up for marriage, we take pride in the One who has always stood up for us. The world may say awful things about us, persecution may follow, but the love of Christ compels us to speak. In Him alone is healing for our fallen world. And in Him alone we stand securely as we await the wedding feast (Matt. 22:1-14).

The devil, through the world society, is continually attacking our faith and pressuring us to conform to their misguided view. As the generations of today and tomorrow fall more in line with this thinking they are progressively rejecting God and His word all together. We are called to hear and reflect upon God's Word and once more come to Him for forgiveness. Then, in love, share this good news of God's great mercy with others.

Due to inflation of the cost of food stuffs, the price of the dinner was raised to \$12.00, which includes a bratwurst sandwich, German potato salad, sauer-kraut, a dessert, and bottle of water. Advance ticket sales are encouraged to help determine the amount of food to prepare. Tickets are available from Wayne Becker, and money should be returned to him preferably no later than October 10th. Meals may be pur-

chased at the drive thru line. Serving will be from 4:30 to 6:30 that evening. A volunteer helper sign up sheet is available in the narthex. Also, fruit pies or sheet cakes donations are requested for dessert servings.

Proceeds from this event will be distributed between the church's mortgage debt and Lutheran Church Charities ministries. Thrivent Financial has approved our project and has sent a kit with \$250 to help defer the cost of food. We thank them for their generous support to our community.




