



Christian burial service was held at Glory of Christ Lutheran church in Plymouth, MN. The Yount family played a vital role in the formation and early stages of Faith's development in Kewanee. Robert preceded her in death.

**Church Council Report:** The September treasurer's report was distributed and Sue reported that the general fund has \$40,445.63 the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$9,212.19 for a total of \$49,957.82. The church extension fund balance is \$100,860.94. Monies were transferred from the dedicated fund to general fund to pay for elevator repairs.

Pastor Weber reminded us that he will be on vacation from October 1 through the 13th. Rev. Grieser will conduct service on October 5th at 11:00AM, and the LWML prayer service will be used on October 12th. Pastor is leading a review of the Augsburg Confession for the Elders.

Chairman Bill announced he has sold aluminum cans for a receipt of \$79. He has also spoken to the man who hays our field and he is to cut again next week.

Gary Hahn will replace Ted as our delegate to the R.I. Circuit forum on Sunday, Sept. 21st, as Ted will be out of town.

Prices for bratwurst sausages and bacon were received from Sullivan's and Save-a-lot. Bids were equal, but Save-A-Lot promised 5 ounce sausages. Gary will place food orders with Save-a-lot store.

Trustee reported cracks in parking lot were filled and patched. Contractor was paid. Still need to mount new solar night light in the rear lot.

New electrical fire panel and smoke detectors for the elevator is to be installed next week after delays in receiving materials were experienced.

**R.I. Circuit Forum:** A Circuit forum was held on September 21st at St. John's-Geneseo to elect delegates to the 2026 LCMS Synodical Convention. The Pastoral Delegate chosen was Rev. Ken Astrowski, Immanuel R.I. with Rev. Dave Anderson, Trinity-Coal Valley as the alternate. Lay delegates elected were Derick Drockelman from Concordia-Geneseo with Jim Homann, St. John's-E. Moline as the alternate.

**Q.** There is so much violence today; wars, disease, natural disasters, so why does God allow all this suffering in the world?
